

## › ICAME 41 – Video Presentations and Extended

### Abstracts

#### ▶ Video Presentations

As already outlined in the main document, we will offer the opportunity to produce a video presentation for those who have been accepted to the main conference and/or the pre-conference workshops. Below, you will also find further specifications and information regarding the submission process.

- The video presentation should be between five and 20 minutes long for full papers and software demonstration. Work-in-progress reports should be between five and ten minutes long. Those who have been accepted for a poster presentation are also welcome to produce a three to five minute long video alongside their poster.
- We will need your finished presentations at least two days before the conference starts, i.e. on **Monday, May 18<sup>th</sup>**.
- In terms of the format, we would recommend producing a screencast (recording your screen/slides while doing a voice-over) because they are easy to make and fairly effective as a replacement for traditional presentations. Also, you will find lots of great material and tutorials regarding the production of such a video online. Of course, you are also free to produce some other kind of video and to be creative with it.
- Please make sure that your video does not include any copyrighted material (including images) which you do not have a license (or any other suitable form of consent) for.
- Please also consider publishing your video under a [Creative Commons](#) license. This would make sharing and using your content much easier for both the organizers as well as for other researchers. If you decide to use any of the CC licenses, please include a license statement in your presentation.

- Attached you will find a consent form. You are, of course, able to limit the exposure of your video presentation to the conference dates (they will be available on a password protected website).

▶ Extended Abstracts

As a replacement for both the traditional book of abstracts and conference proceedings, we would ask you to submit an extended abstract outlining your research and your results.

Your extended abstract should be able to stand independently and it should clearly state your research question(s), approach, method, data and results.

- Length: The extended abstract should not exceed 1200 words (approximately three pages)
- Formatting: Arial, 12pt, 1.5 spacing; headlines in 14pt and bold (If you are using Microsoft Office, we have also attached a template for you)
- References: Please provide references in APA style (in-text citation)

Before publishing your extended abstracts (first on the conference website; later possibly together with a publisher), there will be one brief round of editing by the organizing team.

▶ Submission of Files

Unfortunately, we will not be able to provide an upload system for the videos. Therefore, we would ask you to send us your files (video, slides, extended abstract) to [icame@as.uni-heidelberg.de](mailto:icame@as.uni-heidelberg.de). Since your video will most likely be a larger file, please use a cloud storage provider of your choice (or a service like *WeTransfer.com*) to attach your larger files.

- Video: Please submit your video as an MP4 in either 720p or 1080p.
- Slides/Additional Documents: If you want to submit slides or any additional documents, please send them as PDFs.
- Extended Abstract: Please send your extended abstract as either DOC/DOCX, ODT, Markdown, or as LaTeX.
